Butler Boats composite Miracle has a foam reinforced vinyl ester, epoxy hull teamed with timber superstructure. It features the new chute position and displays the Butler Boat trademark curved thwart. Epoxy coatings and fillets make the boat strong and down to minimum weight.

#### MIRACLE MEASUREMENT UPDATE

Jan 2021

The **Measurement Rules** on the website have been updated as from Jan 1st 2021 with the only change being that buoyancy checks are now the responsibility of the owner and all references to Annual Inspections on current Measurement Certificates are to be ignored.

Note to Measurers: please amend P6. Item 10 to read:

#### 10 BUOYANCY

Buoyancy shall consist of three separate tanks, the efficiency of which shall be determined by

*the owner*. FRP boats may have a single tank plus sufficient positive buoyancy to remain afloat if

holed.

N.B delete or ignore all reference to Annual Buoyancy Inspections on current Measurement

certificates

To **check your buoyancy** insert a rubber tube into each bung hole in turn - ensure that there is a

good airtight seal - blow into the other end of the tube - then hold thumb over tube end for a short

period of time - remove thumb. - air should blow back through the tube.!

If it doesn't your tanks are not holding pressure and you can look for the leaks by applying watered down washing up liquid or similar and spotting the bubbles when you put pressure into the tank.!

Then clean and repair any small holes (with epoxy or similar)!

I have sometimes been asked for a **RIGGING GUIDE** On the following page is a very basic guide to rigging a Miracle dinghy aimed at those new to the class.!

There is a published tuning guide on the Association website along with advice on Spinnaker systems.!

First some useful lengths ! (Depends slightly on set up)

Jib Halliard	approx 7m
Main Halliard	approx 10m
Spinnaker Halliard	14m
Jib Sheets.	5m
Spinnaker Sheets	12m



#### MIRACLE MEASUREMENT UPDATE



CLEW the lower or aft corner of the sail

#### To Rig your Miracle Jan 2021

• Turn the boat so it is facing into the wind.

• Check all the buoyancy tanks with drain holes have **bungs** fitted. Usually four, two at the rear of the side tanks and two for the forward tank!

#### SPARS

To Step the mast first attach the burgee to the top of the mast.

- Set the mast upright and position it on the mast step leaving about a finger width at its base between the front of the mast and the forward bulkhead!
- Attach the shrouds
- · Fasten the forestay to the front hole in the forestay attachment
- Check the mast.. Looking from the side of the boat, it should be almost upright, sloping back slightly (this slope is known as mast rake) see tuning guide for further information!
- Attach the boom to the mast with the gooseneck fitting.
- Attach the kicking strap ( it runs from mast foot to an eye on the boom about 50cm along)
- Thread the mainsheet. For a rear main it runs from the transom up to the boom and back to the transom. For centre main see photo.!
- Attach the rudder and tiller to the transom.

#### SAILS

• attach the main halyard to the head of the mainsail thread the head of the mainsail into the groove on the back of the mast and pull up the main halyard until the sail reaches the bottom of the black band at the top of the mast. The sail is loose footed and the clew is attached to an outhaul on the end of the boom while the tack is attached to an adjustable rope called a Cunningham near the mast. The kicking strap can now be set. As a general rule, in light



winds, no tension. In medium winds a small amount of tension. In heavy winds, lots of tension. •

•Attach the tack of the **jib** to the forestay attachment fitting with a short length of line or a shackle.

•Attach the head of the jib to the jib halyard and hoist

 In light to medium winds the halyard should be just hand tight. In heavy winds have the halyard much tighter.





• Attach the jib sheets to the clew of the jib.

• Thread the jib sheets through the jib fairleads. (The photo shows inboard sheeting, your boat may not have this)

The sheets should go inside the shrouds. Tie figure of eight knots in the ends of the jib sheets.

The boat is now ready to launch.

#### Family Members Two Boat Discount:

For Family Members bringing two or more boats to the 2021 National Championships a £50.00 discount on their second boat (First, third and any subsequent boats pay standard fees).

#### First Nationals Discount:

For first time entrants to the Nationals a discount of £50.00. Note: electronic payment available - see entry form.

#### Entry Fee above includes:

On the water boat cost for racing

Boat space parking

Car parking

#### Entry Fee above excludes:

Due to the current Covid situation we are currently awaiting catering costs from Rutland SC and are therefore excluded from above boat entry fee. {Note: at some previous national event entry costs have included 2 tickets for the Commodore's Reception, for helm & crew and 2 tickets for Prizegiving meal, for helm & crew}. Social event & catering costs for competitors, including options for additional Adults and Children to be advised in due course.

We would obviously encourage all competitors, family and friends to attend the Friday evening prizegiving meal.

Rutland SC have advised that Covid restrictions may apply - tba nearer the time.

#### Safety Boat cover:


