So to our first Miracle sailing. We're preparing for Welton and all that is needed now is for the weather to co-operate! Gillan Gibson Miracle 3670


### Chairman's Desk


## Going to an open meeting: Give it a go



## Building Etty Ketty II - part 1

When John Topliss ordered his boat from Dave Butler he became involved in the build, calling in to see how she was

progressing and taking lots of photos. In the first of 3 parts we start a sequence showing the build with John's comments.

This first photo shows the vinyl ester hull in its "raw" state. As you can see, it looks a bit like the liner for a garden pond at this stage. However, it is a bit more sophisticated than it looks.

The yellow and green panels are closed cell foam stiffening, bonded to the inside of the hull. They are of different density, dependent upon the duty required, and there is further

reinforcement in areas of high stress like the mast step and the shroud attachment points.

My last boat, 3732, was also a composite hull, but was just standard GRP. The new hull is much stiffer( and lighter). However, I am sad to report, all the high tech stuff does not point the boat in the right direction, that is still down to the helm!!



Next we see the first frames in place. At this stage they are not fixed. Dave and Andy took immense care with this set up to ensure that everything is spot on. Not very flashy work, but absolutely vital for the boat's performance in the future.



Once Dave and Andy were happy with the set up, the frames were fixed in place with epoxy. Everything started to look a bit more "boat like" and "ship shape"

Notice that the wood braces remain on the hull to stabilise the shape at this stage of construction; not pretty, but effective.

At the bow, you can see the construction of the half tank. Apart from its function as a safety feature and a platform for the spinnaker, it forms, together with the spinnaker chute, an immensely strong and rigid structure at the bow. (I mention this in case anyone has ideas of sneaking in at the favoured end of the start line.)





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### **Measurement Matters**

Three rules were amended slightly at the recent committee meeting to correct anomalies. They concern: the number of inspection hatches allowed per tank and how placed; the materials allowed for constructing rudder stocks; and a slight increase in the positioning of Tang eyes and T terminals on the mast.

#### INSPECTION HATCHES

Under **PERMITTED EXCEPTIONS** 8[I] amended to read:

"Maximum two screw type Ventilation Hatches for each tank - maximum size 152mm diameter (6" dia.)."

Rational: it assists boats with false floors to install hatches in side tanks; it can assist installation of reduced sheeting fixings in FRP boats; it is more suitable for the half height front tanks being produced as standard.

#### **FOILS**

## under CENTREBOARD, CENTREBOARD CASE, RUDDER AND TILLER

**4** [f] amended to read:

"The Stock, Tiller and Tiller Extension are optional in size and shape, and shall be constructed of wood, metal, or glass fibre and resin, or any combination thereof." (measurement 70 similarly reworded)

Rational: several commercial stocks already in use; it can provide a lighter weight alternative.

#### **SPARS**

Under **SPARS** measurement 83 amended to read:

"Mast step to centre of shrouds and forestay tang eyes or T terminals

min 4410mm max 4455mm."

Rational: slightly increased tolerances; simpler wording; all current spars now in class.

#### REDUCED SHEETING ANGLE

With reference to Reduced Sheeting Angle please note that the wording states:

"Sheeting angle may be reduced by routing each sheet through a single block or fairlead attached to the Seat Coamings (Part number 25 on the plans) at a minimum distance of 350mm from the centreline of the boat and not more than 2325mm from the aft side of the aft transom. These blocks or fairleads may be fixed, or attached to a sliding track mounted on the Seat Coamings."

I realise all rules are open to interpretation, but it was never the aim to radically affect the crews seating position which is a positive feature of the boat. Therefore, the above attachment positions were specified in order to maintain this feature.

The following photographs were submitted as a **proposed** fitment. They detail a fairly substantial shelf added to the side tanks to which the tracks would

be screwed. In no way can the sliding track be considered as mounted on the seat coamings in this example and installations such as this would be considered as outside the Rules. In the last Halo under "Some suggested methods" the track is shown screwed onto a small wooden fillet installed to take the curve out of the seat coaming which is perfectly permissible as the sliders will not work on a curved track. We will need to allow some form of spacer for the FRP boats as their seat coamings are further apart than those of the wooden boats. This is due to an oversight on my part. It will be interesting to see this year how much, if any, difference there is to boats using this system. At present the jury is out.

## Single-handed sailing: a consultation

A proposal is being considered to change the rule which states there must be 2 people on board for Association events. Currently Miracles are widely sailed single-handed at club level, but are not allowed to sail the boat this way for Association events. Other classes, including the Mirror, allow people to race single-handed against double-handed boats on equal terms.

The intention is to discuss this at the AGM this year (2013) with a view to allowing single-handed boats to enter events on a trial basis for a year before a vote at the next year's AGM (2014).

In light airs, single-handed sailors may have an advantage (as do a

lightweight 2 person team in light airs), but this is probably outweighed by it being more difficult to use the spinnaker and the lack of weight when the wind is stronger. It is hoped more single-handed Miracle sailors would join the Association and that entries may increase by one or two per event (at last year's Mirror Nationals there were 2 single-handed entries. One finished 37th and the other 43rd).

## Miracle Association Committee Summary of minutes

#### Upton- 16<sup>th</sup> March 2013

- ISAF advertising Codes: a proposal to formalise and confirm the provisional agreement made at the last meeting and confirmed in the Autumn 2012 Halo to be put forward at the AGM.
   "On boat "to be clarified.
- Membership: Membership renewals have been sent out.
- Measurement Matters
  - ♦ Ventilation hatches: The addition of 2<sup>nd</sup> ventilation hatch per buoyancy tank, but not limited to vertical surfaces, a maximum 2 each tank to assist boats with false floors, installation of reduced jib sheeting in FRP boats and more suitable for half height front tanks.
  - Foils: The stock, tiller and tiller extension to be optional in size shape and constructed in wood, metal, or glass fibre resin, or any combination thereof since several commercial stocks are already available and can provide a lighter alternative.
  - ♦ Mast tang eye and T terminal: A rationalisation of measurement to shroud and forestay tang eye and T terminal. Masts from Needlespar and more recently Superspar have had their T terminal plates located 15 mm lower than permitted Measurement No.83 in error. Since approx 30 masts were supplied before this error was spotted the best solution is to amend the Rule to incorporate all measurements.
  - ♦ Foresail area: The foresail area is

- restricted in luff length due to the leech length being at its maximum. With only minor adjustment to this measurement the area can be increased from 2.23 to 2.37 sq mtrs. Equating to a 6% increase. It was agreed that this change was not essential and could alienate part of the Fleet but could be discussed at the next AGM if considered important enough.
- ♦ Laminate sails: There was further discussion, the Committee recognising that at the last AGM if polyester only was proposed, then it might have been accepted. No further action to be taken unless further proposals are received.
- ♦ Technical Sub Committee: This is to be set up under Brian Jones's control to assist and advise on technical issues. One of the first issues will be the reduced sheeting arrangement for plastic Miracles.
- **Finances:** The finances of the Association are sound.
- **2014 Dinghy Show:** A larger stand is to be taken in celebration of 40 years of the Miracle.
- Yachts and Yachting boat test: The magazine is interested in doing a report.
- **Website:** Updating is continuing and ways of improving the site pursued.
- "Contact us": It is suggested more use is made of this facility on the website.
- *Halo*: The next issue is due out early April.

- 2013 open meetings: The programme was finalised, though details of a Sprint Championship at the end of season is require confirming.
- £5 credit: There will be a credit of £5 per Open Meeting travelled to which will count as a discount against the 2014 Nationals entry fee.
- National Championships 2013: Many details were finalised for the event at Weymouth.
- National Championships 2014: These will be at Hunstanton Sailing Club in their new clubhouse.
- National Championships 2015: These are to be at Rutland Water Sailing Club.
- National Championships 2016 and 2017: Options were discussed and are to be pursued.

- Secretary: John Tippett has advised he is to retire at the next AGM. A new secretary is being looked for.
- **Crew size:** Consideration is to be given to removing the requirement for 2 sailors in the boat during Association events. This will allow singlehanded sailing and more sailors in the boat during racing. There is to be a thread on the Forum on the website and an article in *Halo*.
- AGMs: In future the registration of members and counting of votes is to be improved.
