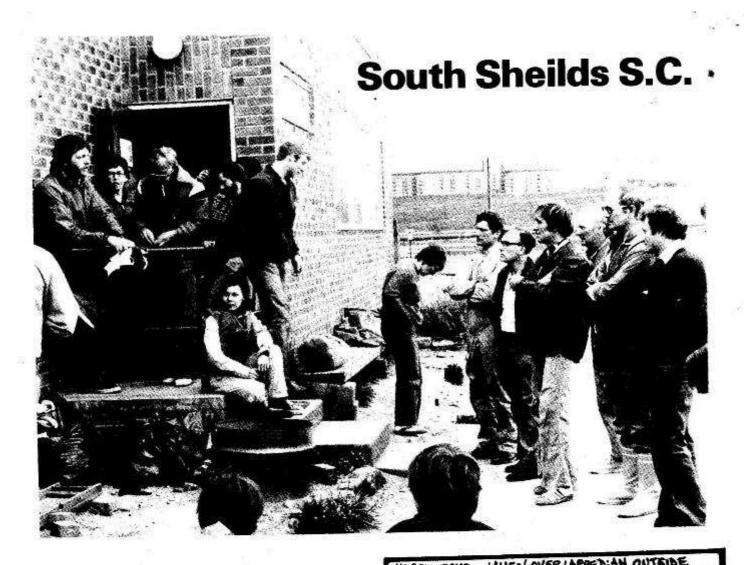

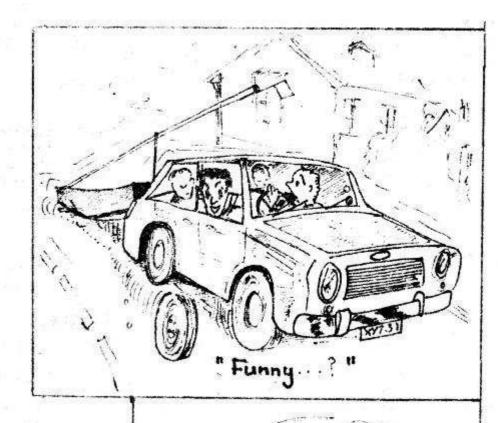

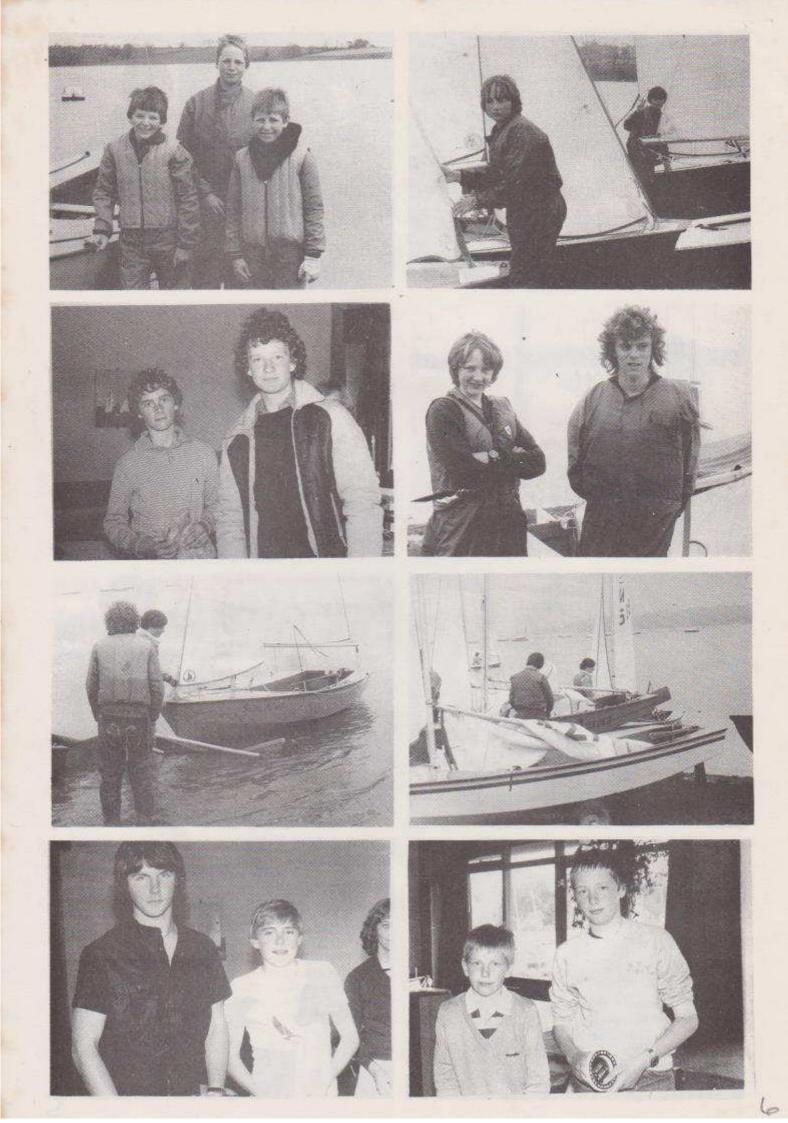


























On opening up my post one day

Up, Up and Away

There have been several attempts in the past to produce a roof-top carrying system for a small boat (lifting even a 10-footer bodily on to a roof is quite an effort) which not only simplifies the process but makes singlehanded operation possible.

A recent version from Practical Designs seems to offer several advantages, not the least of which is that in its normal, trundle-around-the-dinghy-park position the wheels are close to a normal launching trolley position — near to the dinghy's centre of gravity — and the aluminium framed trolley/cradle weighs only 46lb.

To load the dinghy the stern is raised, allowing the wheel assembly to fall back into position (where it locks automatically), and then with the stern elevated in this way the bow is raised and

placed on the rear bar of the rack on the car. The boat can then be slid forward and the trolley/cradle secured to the rack with clamps supplied with the kit. The wheels then pivot further aft and are secured in such a position as to clear the boot of the car. The cradle is designed to fit most conventional, gutter mounted, carrying racks and to be adjustable to fit most saloons, hatch backs and estates — and even the Mini. Although designed originally for the Miracle the rack adjusts to accept the Mirror and many other dinghies up to around 200lb weight.

Practical Designs offer the trolley, which they call the Light-Lift as a bolt-together kit (with instructions) for £197 and can be contacted at 13A Roundwood Park, Harpenden, Herts.

reviewed the system and I have reproduced their article in this newsletter. I would like to thank YACHTS AND YACHTING for allowing me to do this and recommend the magazine and the launching system. Those of you with caravans may find the idea particularly useful. I am often asked if a Miracle can be car-topped. I haven't tried it but plenty of people have. Ken Price was the first person to arrive at our club with a Miracle on the roof of his Cortina, a caravan in tow WITH A MIRROR DINGHY THRUST THROUGH THE CARAVAN REAR WINDOW. There is no truth in the rumour put about that the passengers had to walk up the steeper hills on the way. Incidentally I think

his Cortina has a 1600 c.c. engine.

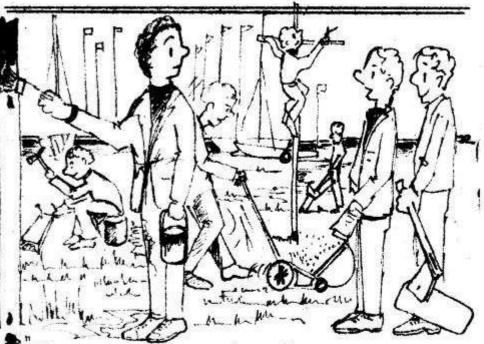

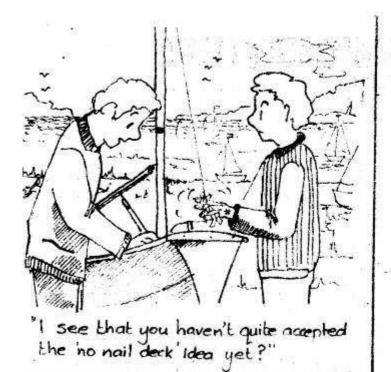

Could I firstly notify all interested Miracle Sailors that LEIGH S.C. OPEN will be held on 11th. July 1982 and we look forward to meeting old friends.

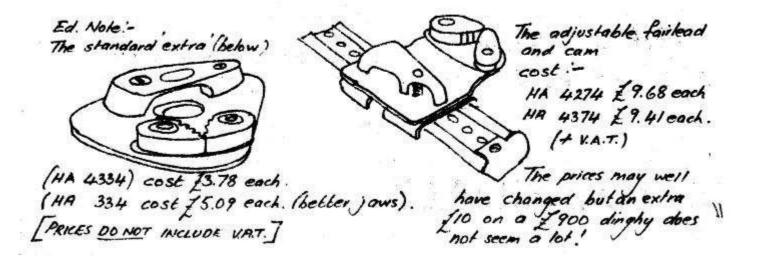
Whilst writing to you for the first time I will use the opportunity to thank you for your excellent work as editor of 'HALO'. I do look forward to each issue but also realise that a few more 'pens

to paper' would help you create an even more interesting newsletter. I know that there is constant discussion about modifications to the Miracle dinghy I i.e. whether any alterations should have been permitted at all, or where to draw the line. I would like to raise the subject again about adjustable fairleads. Apart from the obvious facility to tune the sails correctly, the over riding advantage would be to avoid the need to have a series of holes in the side decks resulting from either misplaced fairleads originally or from subsequent re-location following purchase of new sails (some of our side-decks would double as cribbage pag-boards). Surely this is an area where Common Sense should confirm the acceptance of this modification. As Fleet Captain of Leigh S.C. I had some anxieties that our fleet was becoming depleted with some of the less enthusiastic members giving up sailing altogether and some of the younger members 'moving up' into boats where there is currently more competition in the club. However, during the past few weeks we have received approaches from several new prospective members - some who already have Miracles, and some who are seriously condidering purchasing one as their first dinghy. Let's hope that the graph is on the upturn. I mention this because it is now apparent to me that within a club, individual classes do fluctuate from year to year, but if the boat is 'right' there is no reason why the longterm situation should not be good.

MEMBERSHIP REP

It is approximately a year since my last report in 'HALO' and time to bring you up to date regarding membership. This is my third yearly report and it is interesting to look back at the previous two.

The first, at the end of 1979, written at a time when the recession was not even forecast, was remarkable inits optimism. Membership stood at 680 and rising (I even ordered 1,000 membership cards in anticipation of the continued upsurge). At the end of 1980 however, the membership had fallen by approximately 18% and I am afraid that the trend has continued in 1981 with a further fall of 19%.

I think the further reduction in membership is to some extent to be expected during a period of recession but I do not think this should allow us to become complacent. I know from experience at my own club that some members, although they still own Miracles Miracles, have just not renewed their membership presumably to conserve the pennies at a time when money is tight. Remember when you are thinking of renewing your subs., that the 1982 figure is only £5 - that's just over 9p per week! (Most of us pay more than this for a cup of tea at the sailing club). I am sure you will agree that this is incredible value for money and I remind you of what you get for this tiny outlay:-

an excellent tragular newsletter keeping you up to date with news, events, and class developments.

b) Compatition in National, Area and Open events.

Can I also remind you of the importance of keeping a strong Association in order to:

- a) Maintain adequate control of the 'one design' nature of the Miracle.
- b) Promote the growth of the class.

We now have our yearly membership stickers so that fleet members who have omitted to renew their membership can be readily spotted. Try and make sure that all your fleet are Association Members. That is one thing that we can do something about!

Well, after the gloom lets look at the Club positions. I have again listed all the clubs with 3 or more Association Members but this year I have added the clubs with 2 and 1 members to complete the record and so that you can see where the potential growth areas are.

Although some of the larger fleets have reduced, the cheering news is that the number of clubs with 3 or more has increased by three since last year. Some have left this category but those welcome additions are:

COMBS, DOVESTONE, HENLEY MIDMAR (S.Africa), KINGSMEAD, and SOUTHAMPTON.

Please find enclosed a poster advertising our Club which I would be grateful if you would forward to the North Lincolnshire Club for display at the National Dinghy Exhibition.

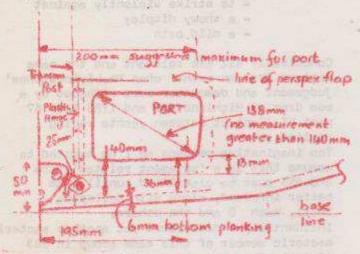

I'm still waiting.
In desparation, as I am anxious to get them fitted and the boat repainted, I decided to try and reason it out. Did I ? No: At this point please read the letter in conjunction with the enclosed full size drawing.

(This is a scaled down drawing of Mr. Turner's excellent sketch. Ed.)



If the port is made with no measurement greater than 140mm, and it is assumed that a 13mm overlap all round is not unreasonable on the flap, then due to the combination of the Transom Post, Rudder Pintle and the flange of the plastic drain hole it is impossible to install within the measurements given.

Could you please enlighten me. There must be other people in the same boat (pardon the pun) As you can see from the drawing, the distance measured to the bottom of the port runs from 40mm to 36 mm with the shape of the bottom. If the drain hole was not there, then it could be done possibly. But this is a standard fitting, provided in the correct place.

Anticipating your assistance, thank you very much.

Dear Mr. Turner,

Thank you very much for your letter - and you are quite right 'HALO' was misleading . . in the matter of Transom Flaps. Perhaps

I can now attempt to put matters right. As an Association we cannot change rules of measurement without the concent of the designers, or copyright holders. For this reason all our measurement recommendations have to be referred to the Daily Mirror who may, accept, reject or accept in a modified form the proposals put to them. The original proposal for 'Transom Flaps' was put to the A.G.M. in October 1980. The proposal was accepted by the members and passed on to the Daily Mirror Group for approval. The proposal was left rather vague, to say the least, since the proposal asked for Flaps not PORTS and suggested only one measurement ,i.e. HOLES should have no dimensions greater than 140mm. Actually everyone at the meeting understood. It was left to the copyright holders to work out the exact details rather than the Miracle Association waste time working things out exactly only to have their ideas rejected later. Well, things take time and many people, having not read the FINAL measurement rules (since they weren't at that time available) decided to go ahead making what they considered to be a 'reasonable' guess at the outcome of the Association's discussions on the matter with the copyright holders. People whent ahead and fitted the flaps bearing in mind the '140mm rule' and the possibility that the copyright holders would insist that the ports cut in the transom of the dinghy would in no way damage the taping. For this reason a SAFE distance of 25mm MEASURED INSIDE the boat is recommended. The drawing in the June issue of HALO is misleading because it shows this measurement taken OUTSIDE the boat. In an attempt to put matters right later in the same edition a hand written attempt at correcting this ended up by quoting a measurement of 24mm (should be 25mm) measured inside the boat (right) but suggests that the measurement is a MAXIMUM when it clearly should be a MINIMUM. I hope I have got it right this time! Incidentally I have looked through all the 'HALOS' and the minutes of past Committee meetings and cannot find any reference to this particular measurement. Can any other member of the Committee jog my memory please?.

The following letter, which has been reproduced in part below, was written to Vic Shaw towards the end of lest year...

MASTS

".Dear Sir,

I wish to bring to your attention what I consider to be a serio s design fault in the mast supplied with my Miracle dinghy,

sail number 3216, which I purchased in April 1981.

The boat was supplied with the Proctor mast in which the mainsail track is part of the extrusion. The entry to the mainsail luff rope track is as sketched below and although my boat has been sailed no more than twenty times the bottom of the track has caused severe chafing on the tack of my mainsail. This has now reached the point where a repair is needed before it is too late. I look forward to hearing your proposals for repairing my damaged mainsail and preventing the damage occuring again.

I think that the Mirror Group and the owner of the mast came to some arrangement whereby the sail was repaired but I wonder if there are more unhappy Proctor owner or, indeed, those of you who may think the new masts an improvement? I talked to someone on Proctor's stand at the Boat Show and I suggested that the luff track entry could be modified. Procors say that their masts should be O.K. with standard kit sails but owners could have difficulty with sails cut in other lofts. However the last I heard was indirectly from Ian Pinnell who thinks the Proctor mast perfectly O.K. but Harry Yule-Smith, I'm told, has decided to have a Holt mast with his new boat. Apparently there was great alarm when Graeme's Proctor mast broke during the Midlands but again John Wilson's mast looked

very nesty after it tried to tie itself in a knot during the Northerns! Perhaps the lesson is MAKE SURE THAT WHEN YOU ORDER A NEW SET OF SAILS THAT THE SAIL-MAKER KNOWS which most he is cutting sails for. Other than that I do not know which is best. I suppose that Holt masts can still be purchased from Holts although they are probably becoming more and more expensive. I didn't get the feeling that Proctors are likely to alter their present design. ARE THERE ANY ENGINEERS WHO COULD STUDY BOTH MASTS AND
