Members are asked to support with offers to be available to talk with visitors on the stand for a couple of hours over these two days. Please let Graham and /or Helen know if you can assist.


It has been a pleasure to see everybody on the events circuit again this year!

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

RUTLAND NATIONALS

8th - 13th August 21

Full report

This years' National Championships was held at Rutland Sailing Club, with a fleet of 16 boats. Overall, the conditions were breezy throughout the week. The racing during the week was close throughout the fleet and generally good-natured. The windy conditions definitely highlighted any weaknesses in the pre-Championship boat preparation with work ongoing throughout the week across the fleet. Those with new boats also took the opportunity to tune their boats each day.

The racing started on the <u>Sunday</u>, with a very heavy breeze with the Practice Race and the Race 1. There were many thrills and spills with lots of capsizing due to the breezy conditions. Staying upright was the name of the game and the results were dictated by the ability to stay upright. Hannah Metcalfe-Smith lost Tom as he dived backwards overboard mid-capsize after contesting a kite leg overtake by Simon Reddcliff and Mark Atherton.

We had a reception in the Rutland club house and were warmly welcomed by the Commodore, with the peaceful weather conditions a marked change from the racing conditions earlier in the day. Monday's racing was once again, breezy, but provided the only upset to the Davy's week, with Hannah and Tom Metcalfe-Smith taking 1st place in the second Championship race. <u>Tuesday</u>, the third day of the Nationals provided some deserved sunshine and more tight racing conditions, with three boats vying for first place with the Willar's completing penalty turns for a port/starboard infringement on the Davy's. As we raced through the week, Wednesday meant we were over halfway through the event!

The quietest day of the whole event enabled four races to take place, with two points races and two novelty races; the single-handed and non-spinnaker.

An annual pub quiz provided some excellent entertainment for the evening and having a good age range in the teams proved to be essential for scoring highly.

The penultimate day of racing on Thursday showed the Miracles to be ill-disciplined with multiple general recalls required. Another breezy day meant for some capsizes, some seri-

ously tight racing and some turns needed for port and starboard incidents throughout the fleet. The final race on the Friday was sailed in big breeze, very reminiscent of how we started the week. It proved to be an exciting race, with the space to move up and down the fleet depending on how the results panned out

Wayne and Angela lead the race initially, which would have taken them to second place overall, but an unfortunate capsize meant that Hannah and Tom snuck through to retain second place, sailing a conservative race.

Overall, the Nationals was a well-organised event, with excellent coursesetting and race management. It was a sociable affair with lots of interesting thrills and spills, boat repairs and incredibly tight racing throughout the week.

Lots of the sailors were grateful to get out on the water after a constrained start to the season due to the lockdowns we have all endured.

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Crews arrived on Saturday at Girton Sailing Club with a forecast of 2 to 4 knots of wind a light rain although in true Girton style the rain held off and a light 5 knot breeze looked to be coming down the lake.

The race officer planned a course around the cans in and out of the tricky island passage to keep the fleet on their toes for the the day.

As the fleet launched the wind all but completely shut down leaving the occasional fickle puff to drop in unpredictably in random places around the pond.

The decision to get race one underway unsurprisingly resulted in a clean start as the fleet began a gruelling task of picking transoms on the land just to check they were moving in the right direction over a glass pond. Nevertheless the fleet stayed tight as they made slow progress around the course and the lead changed almost with every shift giving most crews a chance at the front.

An hour later at the leeward mark Jon and 7 year old daughter Jess Willars decided to call it quits and headed for the shore to retire. Sure enough then the inevitable happened and the wind filled to a decent 5-6kts to get the fleet home before an abandonment with Wayne and Angela making the very best of it to take the win over Tracey and Gemma and then Gérard and Frances.

The race officer wasted no time getting race 2 underway with a simplified course and Jon and Jess rejoining the fleet after a short break.

In the final minute of the start the wind faded once again to a delicate and shifty breath which caught Wayne and Angela out on the right side of the course worst leaving them to watch the fleet from the left take the advantage.

Close racing throughout the fleet then followed with some decent shifts dropping in to test concentration levels.

By the last run it was Tracey and Gemma leading the way with Andrew Robinson and Hannah Mudford sailing well in second then Jon and Jess 3rd. As they all rounded for the final short beat to the finish the first 2 boats headed to the right hand side with Jon and Jess taking the left to find a lucky right shift boosting them into the lead just at the finish whilst Wayne and Angela had sailed their way back up to 4th place.



Sunday forecast looked much more consistent and 3 back to back races were planned.

Jon and Jess made it to the windward mark first followed by Wayne/Angela and Tracey/Gemma. This was to be the order of the day for the first leg of all 3 races.

At the leeward mark
Wayne clipped the transom of Jon as they rounded
and promptly did his
turns before working
the shifts exceptionally
well to take the lead to
the finish.

Tracey/Gemma also found the extra speed downwind to pass Jon/Jess.

ace 2 saw much of the same with Wayne/Angela gaining the lead closely followed by Tracey/Gemma and Jon/Jess. A close tacking battle between the 3 boats up the tight passage of the island resulted with Jon/Jess back in the lead...but not for long as a shift on the next beat saw them back in 3rd behind Tracey/Gemma and Wayne/Angela.

Wayne/Angela now had the event in the bag with a race to spare but still came out fighting for the final race of the day which ended in the same 3 boats at the front but this time

Tracey/Gemma taking a well deserved win over Wayne/Angela and Jon/Jess.

Well done to all competitors.

At the prize giving Wayne thanked the race committee and the organisers at Girton for doing a fantastic job of getting all 5 races in under some very challenging conditions which resulted in some really close and exciting racing throughout.

Thornbury 17th & 18th July

Only two boats attended the Miracle Open that was part of the Thornbury S. C. Regatta. The Miracles were included in the Slow Handicap fleet.

Congratulations to Helen and Graham winning the Thornbury Miracle Trophy on the hottest, sunniest weekend of the year so far.

Two firsts on Saturday secured the win, from Hannah and Tom who were sailing a borrowed boat, as theirs was still under renovation.

Only one race was completed in light winds on the Sunday which was won by Hannah, crewed by Nick.





The Miracle Midland Championship at Staunton Harold Sailing Club got off to a great start with a light and shifty breeze and sunshine.

Race 1

The first race started at 1400, with a complicated course. The first mark was busy with Hannah Metcalfe-Smith and her Dad Nick Smith round first, with Tracy Amos and Gemma Gibson in second, with the Association Chairman Paul Robinson and his crew Dave Dyson third around the mark.

On the second lap, Tracy and Gemma got the inside track and got in front of Hannah and Nick, with Jon and Jess Willars coming into third place, with Paul and Dave dropping back to finish 5th.

Race 2

In the second race, Jon and Jess had a cracking start at the pin, crossing the fleet on port, making it to the windward mark first, with Tracy and Gemma in 2nd and Hannah and Nick in 3rd, with Paul and Dave in 4th.

The cluster of the top three boats stayed together throughout the race with Tracy and Gemma going past Nick and Hannah on the beat, and past Jon and Jess on the gybe.

Gemma and Tracy stayed front to get their second bullet of the day with Jon and Jess in second and Hannah and Nick finishing close behind.

Simon Reddecliffe and Mark Atherton pulled away to come 4th, with Graham and Helen in 5th and Paul and Dave slipped back to finish 6th.

Race 3

Hannah and Nick shot off the favoured committee boat end, but tried to work the shore, whilst Tracy and Gemma utilised the middle of the lake to good effect going first around the windward mark and stayed there for the duration of the race. New arrivals, Wayne and Angela strode into second place, with Jon and Jess Willars in 3rd. With the top three places were settled early on - the main racing was further back in the fleet. The wind of variable strength and direction meant for snakes and ladders on the beat and ever changing spinnaker legs, with the wind

swinging so much that a tight reach turned into a windward leg on the third lap. Hannah and Nick gybed on the mark, but Simon and Mark took a lower track, gybing across through after Nick

and Hannah and before Paul and Dave. They had to gybe again to make the leeward mark with Hannah and Nick going around in front of them to take fourth place.

Race 4

The wind dropped and became flukey for the 4th race after lunch. A congested start line meant that Hannah and Nick went around the windward mark second to last,





Race 5

Having sealed their win without doubt in the fourth race, Tracy and Gemma chose not to compete in the fifth race of the championships as did Dave and Jean and Paul and Dave with the difficult conditions frustrating all of the sailors. Keith Martin and John Whitehouse stuck it out and finished the race in 5th, a best result for them. Jon and Jess Willars escaped the rest of the remaining competitors to get away and stay away to win the race and secure 2nd place overall. 2nd and 3rd place was hard fought between Hannah and Nick and Simon and Mark. A bear away on port for Simon at the windward mark, meant that Hannah and Nick slipped away to secure 2nd place and 3rd overall.

The wind conditions made tough and tight racing throughout the fleet over the weekend but the slick boat handling of Tracy and Gemma unbeatable, as evidenced by their clean sweep.







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
