in 1962 Rene Savelli and a number of others who had been on the waiting list for Bolton Sailing Club set up their own club at Delph reservoir, using a wooden garage as the clubhouse. There was no electricity, with lighting provided by bottled gas.

As one of the founding members, Rene has been presented with a prestigious award for her lifetime commitment as a volunteer.

She received her award from the President of the RYA, HRH the Princess Royal at a ceremony in London on the 22nd November 2019.



At first Rene was crewing for other members in double handed boats. "There weren't many ladies sailing in those days," she recalls. Eventually as an accomplished sailor she got her own double hander, a Graduate and then changed to the Miracle class, sailing in ten National championships. She also became the Honorary Secretary of the club and ultimately the first woman Commodore in 2006.

Recently retired from competitive sailing, Rene now organises the club's training programme, attending around 20



meetings a year to ensure their success. She also does duties in the Race Control room, helps in the Galley and forms part of the welcome for new trainees that has helped the club be singled out for being 'Inclusive and open to all' and regional finalist in this year's RYA and Yachts and Yachting Club of the Year awards.

The citation says Rene's knowledge, enthusiasm and contribution to the Club over the past 57 years has been immeasurable.

In 2018, Rene took up the Miracle Associations invitation to become an associate Life member. Ian Brown

Miracle Association meetings Summary of minutes

Shustoke Sailing Club 2nd November 2019

- 2019 Nationals at Pwllheli: Considered a successful event it was noted:
 - The Race Officer was excellent and in view of the bad weather and challenging conditions he made the right decisions at the right time.
- The shoreside staff, especially the manager and her family, were instrumental in keeping the shoreside running well and adapting to circumstances.
- There was a financial loss at the event, which had been planned for as it was always know this would be a more expensive venue.

Miracle Association meetings

Summary of minutes (cont.)

• Trophies:

- Ian Southwell had stood down as Trophy Officer. A possible replacement was suggested and they are to be approached.
- Trophy winners 1976 to date: John Tippett has compiled a list of trophy winners from various sources. A "Roll of Honour" of the key Nationals results will be added to the website.
- ♦ **Travellers Trophy:** Qualifying events are those listed in the Miracle Association Calendar. except the Nationals do not count. The Travellers Trophy counts events after the Nationals in one season through to all the events in the following season prior to the Nationals. The format of any particular event is not relevant and it can be a championship, open meeting, or part of a regatta or club event. It is the inclusion in the published Miracle Association Calendar as an Association event so that sailors are able to plan ahead the events which is key.
- **Chair's report:** Paul Robinson referred to his piece in the Autumn 2019 *Halo*.
 - Paul had compiled a spread sheet of key dates. The dates for proposals for the 2020 AGM are on page 23.
- Halo: The Autumn 2019 issue had just been published and preparations are in hand for the January 2020 issue;
 - Efforts are to be made to attract more advertisers;

 Advertising: This makes a major contribution to costs. The rates are:

- 2019 Treasurer: The Association is in a sound financial position. It was noted the popularity of the 3 year membership option brought a bump in the fees received in some years.
- Measurement:
 - The website will be reviewed and updated as neceaary
 - 4 Miracles have either been built, or are being built
 - Registration Fee": This is an inclusive amount which includes a sail number, copies of the relevant building manual and registration.
- Website: Kept under review as always
 - Those wishing to post items contact webmaster or Keneth Gibson
 - Links to Yachts and Yachting for open meetings useful as a number of sailors were sending results and reports promptly to the magazine.
 - Information on the 2020 events will be posted on the website with a link to the host club's website.
 Flyers for events to be requested and posted on the relevant pages.
- **Dinghy Show 2020:** The Association's stand is in the West Hall, stand F212, which was considered to be well

ocated. Arrangements are well underway.

- Dinghy Show 2021 and beyond: The value of the Dinghy Show was discussed in view of the cost, both financially and in member's time. Overall costs are usually in the order of £1,000 to £1,500 depending on the size of the stand taken, etc. The concept of attending alternate years was considered. The situation will be reviewed after the 2020 event. It was noted:
 - In straw polls at the AGM there was general agreement participation should continue;
 - The Dinghy Show was used by visitors to view and compare different classes of boat if they were considering a purchase. In the last few years the Miracle had the advantage as many important classes, such as the Enterprise and Mirror, were not there.
 - It was the opportunity for members past and present, plus Miracle sailors past and present, to socialise and discuss the Miracle.
 - A recent trend for information on building the Miracle had been noted with a number of people looking for a project
- 2020 Racing Calendar: See page 5 of this newsletter and the website. Note the change of date for the Delph event to avoid a major running marathon to be held in the area.
- Open meetings: spread of dates and locations: Efforts are made to spread the events over the season and around the country, but the Association is dependent on the host clubs for the

dates available. The possible dates can be limited by various factors, eg:

- How the event fits into the club's programme;
- If tidal, the date can be dictated by the tides;
- Other local circumstances, eg reservoir water levels, risk of weed later in season, another major event in the area such as the marathon in the Delph area, etc.
- **Cruising event:** The event at Ullswater in 2108 had not been well attended despite the organisation and its promotion by Brian and Sharon Worrall. It was decided not to organise an event in 2020, but to keep the situation under review.
- Promoting Open Meetings and other events: A variety of initiatives were discussed and are to be pursued.
- Encouraging Open Meeting attendance: Encouraging more sailors to travel is important and personal connections and encouragement are key. Having events within easy reach and on convenient dates is important, but the Association is dependent on the clubs hosting events for dates and locations available.
- 2020 Nationals Netley Sailing Club, Southampton Water:

Mon to Fri 3rd to 7th August 2020 Miracles welcome to join in Sunday Club racing.

Arrangements are progressing and Brian Jones is to arrange a meeting with Netley Sailing Club to sort out the details, including considering the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions.

 Number of races: It is proposed to have 2 Championship races each day (10 in total), followed by a 3rd

race for the other types of racing, eg Youth and Junior Series, Crews Race, etc.

- Allowing only one suit of sails? At the 2019 AGM it was suggested the restriction to one suit of sails for the Championships be removed. The limit had originally been introduced to stop "chequebook sailing" and on consideration of various aspects it was decided to leave matters as they are. It was noted there is already provision for replacing a badly damaged sail.
- Measurement, including spot checks on sails: Various aspects were discussed. As measurement was currently carried out by sailors who were also competing it was considered better any scrutineering was at the beginning of the event.
- Lay Day: A Lay day was considered but rejected in view of the 2020 event being only 5 days.
- Encouraging the Bronze fleet: A regular topic of discussion is how do we encourage new people to attend the Nationals, particularly new bronze fleet participants? Those relatively new to racing and open meetings were not as common as they once were, with some exceptions. With those that were coming a personal connection with existing Miracle sailors was seen as key. An important aspect was the support offered to help the sailors cope with the new situation. An assortment of suggestions were

made and are to be investigated, though what will work and how will be dependent on who registers so everything is to be kept under review and the availability of assistance promoted. Some of the ideas suggested are:

- * Buddy system;
- * Some form of "Team Race";
- * Additional awards;
- * Sponsorship.
- Future Nationals: 2021 and beyond: A variety of venues have been proposed and are being followed up. Paul Robinson is to see what can be arranged. There continue to be enquires from other fleets for joint events, the latest from the Comets. That link up was not feasible as their Nationals are a 4 day event over a weekend.
- Future Committee meetings: the next meeting is expected to be February/ March 2020.

Rules of Measurement and Construction

Proposal to change the above Rules, for discussion at the Association's Annual General Meeting to be held at Netley Sailing Club on Thursday 6th August 2020.

Published in accordance with Rule 9 of the Rules of the Association.

PROPOSAL

Referring to the Rules of Measurement and Construction 2020.

Buoyancy Checks

Aim. To move to a situation where the owner and not the Association is responsible for the efficiency of a boats buoyancy. The wording of Rule 10 to be altered to remove all reference to a measurer, with the addition of a comment to delete or ignore all reference to Annual Buoyancy Inspections on current Measurement Certificates.

Current wording

Rule10 BUOYANCY

Buoyancy shall consist of three separate tanks, the efficiency of which shall be determined by inspection, or, if the measurer considers it necessary by air test. FRP boats may have a single tank plus sufficient positive buoyancy to remain afloat if holed.

Proposed amended Rule to read:

Rule 10 BUOYANCY

Buoyancy shall consist of three separate tanks, the efficiency of which shall be determined by *the owner*. FRP boats may have a single tank plus sufficient positive buoyancy to remain afloat if holed.

N.B delete or ignore all reference to Annual Buoyancy Inspections on current Measurement certificates
